MET / IP / NEED	<p>Completion <i>and</i> certification will permit a student to transfer from Crafton Hills College to a campus in the CSU system without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division general education courses. Students are required to complete a minimum of 39 units in areas A - F for full certification of lower division general education requirements.
