Fall 2024 Professional Development Attendee Evaluations Results

The findings included in this report stem from the Professional Development (PD) attendee evaluations provided during Flex and In-Service days for the Fall 2024 term. A total of 231 valid responses were received and analyzed, with 160 valid responses for Flex Day and 71 responses for In-Service days.

The survey asked participants to provide feedback on various aspects of the workshops, including relevance and effectiveness of the workshops, their recommendations for future offerings, how they plan to apply the information learned, and suggestions for improvements. It is important to highlight that participation in the survey, as well as responses to individual questions, was voluntary.

Note: SBVC had 15 FT and 71 PT faculty in attendance.

Over 90% of respondents agreed or strongly agreed that the topics were relevant, the presenters were knowledgeable, the presentation style was appropriate, and the information was useful for both professional and personal development, with most also recommending the workshops to their colleagues.

While the overall agreement was high, the Likert scale statement 'The Information Presented Was Useful for My Personal Development' received 12 (7.6%) Disagree and/or Strongly Disagree responses. These responses were primarily associated with the 'What's New in Canvas' and 'Accessibility Checker' workshops, which are more focused on work-related tasks rather than personal development. Although the 'SBCCD Workplace Violence Prevention Plan' had some disagreement, there may be an opportunity to adapt the workshop to address safety beyond the workplace.
