

The findings included in this report stem from the Professional Development (PD) attendee evaluations provided during Flex and In-Service days for the Spring 2025 term. As part of an ongoing effort to meet the PD needs and increase the quality of PD workshops provided to all campus employees, an online evaluation was provided to attendees. A total of **129** valid online evaluations were received and analyzed. A limitation to consider when reviewing these results is that completing an evaluation was optional for attendees, which may help to explain the low number of evaluations for some workshops.

Table I demonstrates the number of evaluations submitted for each workshop offered. There was a total of 21 workshops included in the evaluation. **Evaluations were submitted for 20 of the workshops** offered.

Table 3 reflects the evaluations for **five** of the six workshops presented on **Flex Day, Tuesday, January 14**th: Al Meet LMS: Practical Strategies for Using Khanmigo in Canvas, Better Discussions + Easier Grading: Harmonize Training, Beyond the Screen: Canvas and DE Updates, SBCCD Cyber Security Plan, and Supporting Student Focus & Well-Being: Mindfulness Strategies for Any Classroom. The majority of respondents (92%-100%) indicated agreement or strong agreement with all six statements. Notably, all respondents (n=39) agreed or strongly agreed with the statements that **the topic was relevant and the presenter(s) knowledge of the subject was excellent.**

It's obvious that improvements need to be made (in our teaching for example), but it isn't obvious what the next steps are to help students be more successful. More time to review elements

The emphasis should be on "speed mentoring" like it says in the description. Yes, they give you a detailed rubric that will be used to peer review your course, but the workshop does not allow for in depth questions or discussions on the various topics such as equity, assessment, etc. I'm pretty familiar with accessibility, but the other topics I wasn't so familiar with, **so it would have been helpful for me to go more in depth on the other topics**. Perhaps this workshop could be made a little longer or offered over multiple days.

Empowering Students with Accessibility Needs: Strategies for Working with SAS and Understanding New Legislation Have dedicated time for faculty to express their concerns or provide a way for faculty to give feedback about SAS to identity concerns.

I don't think anything can be improved, however, since we were in the roadrunner café, it can be hard to hear other

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people's questions. If a person from the audience has a question, they should be given a microphone so
that everyone can hear what they are asking. Otherwise, we might miss key details of their question that
would help the rest of us understand the presenter's response.
