Institutional Set Standards (continued)	The EMPC reviewed all of the institutional set standards for each of the four achievement outcomes. Crafton achieved the ISS in all achievement outcomes and for all groups except for one, Native American students. The course completion rate for Native American students in 2021-2022 was below the 63.6% ISS at 50%. This is partially due to the very small number of Native American students, approximately 15. Crafton will be reaching out to each Native American student individually to offer support and resources to each student.  Keith also indicated that we at 464 in certificates and our minimum number is only 204. We will review the ISS for certificates next year and reevaluate the ISS.
