	 Serves as the primary committee to address participatory governance issues. Provides information to and models best practices for participatory governance committees. Assumes oversight and maintenance of the CHC Organizational Handbook. Monitors Policies and Administrative Regulations related to participatory governance, and recommends modifications thereof, or new Policies or Administrative Regulations, as needed. Coordinates and facilitates the systematic evaluation of governance structures and processes. Promotes plan integration and alignment and recommends corrective action as necessary. Relies on research, evidence and learning assessment results to inform participatory governance planning and decision-making.

Approved by CHC President Functional committees are established through President's Cabinet. Functional committees are President's Cabinet, Management Team, Student Services Council as membership is by job title and are considered closed meetings. Constituency Committees are based on job groups i.e. faculty, classified, managers, and students. These meetings are considered closed as well. Shared governance committees are established through Crafton Council. Any changes to their Charge or membership is presented to Crafton Council for review and approval. All shared governance committee reports to Crafton Council. We discussed what a Work Group is. This is a subgroup of a shared governance committee. Gio will update his documentation and we will present the updates at next meeting along with a list of all current committees so we know which group they belong to.
