Facilities Master Plan Schedule - Mike	We are starting on the Facilities Master Plan document which is driven by the Educational Master Plan we recently finished. The FMP will guide CHC into the next decade. We have a consultant helping both colleges create their documents. Because of the FMP addendum that was completed in 2021, we are not starting from scratch. We intend to build upon the information and directions previously developed in the 2017 FMP and the 2021 addendum. The new FMP is scheduled for Board of Trustees approval in March 2025. Mike shared the draft schedule that includes meetings with President's Cabinet, Crafton Council and getting on the schedule for all the senates to get feedback on directions. There is work to be done this semester so the consultants can work over the summer to draft a report. In Fall we will go over the drafts with all the senates (Academic, Classified and Student) allowing time for first and second reads and then to Crafton Council for first and second reads.
